Charles Livingstone is Associate Professor in the School of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Monash University. He is also head of the Gambling and Social Determinants unit within SPHPM. He has research degrees in economics and social theory. Dr. Livingstone's current principal research interest is critical gambling studies, including in particular gambling policy reform and the politics, regulation and social impacts of electronic gambling machine (EGM). He was a member of the Australian Government's Ministerial Expert Advisory Group on Gambling 2010-2012. He contributes regularly to public debate around gambling issues via media and otherwise, and committed to developing research knowledge into forms that can better inform policy-making, and public debate.
